

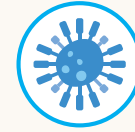
INFORMATION ON COVID-19 AND FLU



1 **COVID-19** and **Flu** are both contagious respiratory illnesses **caused by different viruses**, which continue to change.¹⁻³



COVID-19 is caused by a type of **coronavirus** (SARS-CoV-2).¹



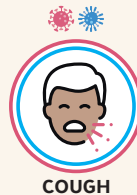
Flu is caused by an **influenza virus**.¹

To help protect against **COVID-19** and **Flu**, different vaccinations are required for each.¹

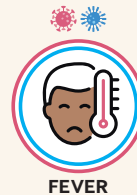
2 **COVID-19** and **Flu** may have **similar symptoms**.¹

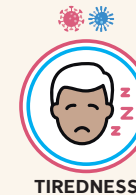
